J-5 2024 Poverty Exemption Guidelines

Suggested Resolution Resolution #2024-01-

WHEREAS, The adoption of guidelines for poverty exemptions is required of the City Council; and,

WHEREAS, The principal residence of persons, who the Assessor and Board of Review determines by reason of poverty to be unable to contribute to the public charge, is eligible for exemption in whole or in part from taxation under Public Act 253 of 2020 (MCL 211.7u); and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to PA 253 of 2020, the City of Troy, Oakland County adopts the following guidelines for the Board of Review to follow. The guidelines shall include but not be limited to the specific income and asset levels of the claimant and all persons residing in the household, including any property tax credit returns, filed in the current or immediately preceding year;

To be eligible, a person shall do all the following on an annual basis:

- 1) Own and occupy the property as a principal residence.
- 2) File Form 5737 Application for MCL 211.7u Poverty Exemption with the Assessor/Board of Review, accompanied by federal and state income tax returns for the current or immediately preceding year, including any property tax credits, for all persons residing in the principal residence (disclosure of the income of an owner who is not residing in the principal residence is not required). Federal and state income tax returns are not required for a person residing in the principal residence tax return. Instead, Form 4988, *Poverty Exemption Affidavit* may be filed for all persons residing in the residence who were not required to file federal or state income tax returns in the current or immediately preceding year.
- 3) Produce a valid driver's license or other form of identification, if requested.
- 4) Produce a deed, land contract, or other evidence of ownership of the property, if requested.
- 5) Meet the federal poverty income guidelines published in the prior calendar year in the Federal Register by the United States Department of Health and Human Services <u>or</u> alternative guidelines adopted by the local assessing unit. The Alternative guidelines cannot provide income eligibility requirements less than the federal guidelines.
- 6) Meet the asset level test adopted by the local assessing unit.

Local units are required to adopt guidelines that set income levels for their poverty exemption guidelines and those income levels **shall not be set lower** by a city than the federal poverty guidelines updated annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Following are the federal poverty guidelines for use in setting poverty exemption guidelines for 2024 assessments:

Size of Family Unit	Poverty Guidelines
1	\$14,580
2	\$19,720
3	\$24,860
4	\$30,000
5	\$35,140
6	\$40,280

7	\$45,420
8	\$50,560
For each additional person	\$5,140

According to the United States Census Bureau "income" includes, but is not limited to:

- Money, wages, salaries before deductions, regular contributions from persons not living in the residence
- Net receipts from non-farm or farm self-employment (receipts from a person's own business, professional enterprise, or partnership, after business expense deductions)
- Regular payments from social security, railroad retirement, unemployment, worker's compensation, veteran's payments, public assistance, supplemental security income (SSI)
- Alimony, child support, military family allotments
- Private and governmental retirement and disability pensions, regular insurance, annuity payments
- College or university scholarships, grants, fellowships, assistantships
- Dividends, interest, and net income from rentals, royalties, estates, trusts, gambling or lottery winnings

The Michigan homestead property tax credit **cannot** be considered as income for purposes of the poverty exemption.

Asset Test Guidelines

Used in the Determination of Poverty Exemptions for 2024

As required by PA 253 of 2020, all guidelines for poverty exemptions established by the governing body of the local assessing unit must include an asset level test. This asset test must clearly state the maximum value of all assets allowable to be eligible for the poverty exemption. This means that the guidelines must state a total dollar amount and the value of all assets cannot exceed the total dollar amount.

The purpose of an asset test is to determine the resources available: cash, fixed assets or other property that could be converted to cash and used to pay property taxes in the year the poverty exemption is filed. The local unit asset test **cannot i**nclude the value of the principal residence.

The following asset test shall apply to all applications for poverty exemption:

- The applicant(s) shall not have assets exceeding the amount shown in the chart below based on the size of the family unit.
- The asset Guideline (test) shall exclude the value of the principal residence subject to the poverty exemption request and exclude the value of one automobile. If multiple automobiles are owned, then the least valuable automobile will be excluded from the asset guideline.
- The applicant(s) shall not have total assets (excluding the value of the principal residence subject to the exemption request and excluding the value of one automobile) more than the guidelines set below. Assets exceeding the amounts stated below will result in a denial of the poverty exemption.

All asset information, as requested in the Application for Poverty Exemption, must be completed in total. The Board of Review may request additional information and verification of assets, if the Board of Review determines it to be necessary and may deny an application if the assets are not properly identified.

The following is a list of assets that are included in the asset test:

- A second home, property, vacant land, vehicles
- Recreational vehicles such as campers, motor-homes, boats and ATV's
- Buildings other than the residence
- Jewelry, antiques, artworks
- Equipment, other personal property of value
- Bank accounts (over a specified amount), stocks
- Money received from the sale of property, such as, stocks, bonds, a house or car (unless a person is in the specific business of selling such property)
- Withdrawals of bank deposits and borrowed money
- Gifts, loans, lump-sum inheritances and one-time insurance payments
- Food or housing received in lieu of wages and the value of food and fuel produced and consumed on farms
- Federal non-cash benefits programs such as Medicare, Medicaid, food stamps and school lunches

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, That the Board of Review **SHALL FOLLOW** the above stated policy, federal guidelines, and asset test in granting or denying an exemption. The Board of Review is not permitted to deviate from the adopted policy and guidelines.

RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR THE CITY COUNCIL CITY OF TROY, MICHIGAN

Proposed: January 8, 2024

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1. ELECTION OF MAYOR PRO TEM:

The election of Mayor Pro Tem shall rotate annually in the following order: Hodorek, Gunn, <u>Chanda,</u> Hamilton, Brooks, Erickson Gault, Chamberlain-Creanga

The order of the rotation is: Current Council Members who have not yet served as Mayor Pro Tem; then, newly elected Council Members ranked by number of votes received; finally, current Council Members who have already served as Mayor Pro Tem. Council Members in office for at least 3 months are eligible to serve as Mayor Pro Tem.

2. DESIGNATION OF ACTING MAYOR:

In the absence or disability of both the Mayor and the Mayor Pro Tem, the Council Member present who has served longest shall be designated Acting Mayor and shall perform the duties of the Mayor.

3. SPECIAL MEETINGS:

Special meetings may be called in accordance with the City Charter and the Open Meetings Act. Special meetings shall be held at 6:00 P.M. in the Council Board Room unless the written notice to each member of the Council provides for a different time and/or place.

a) SPECIAL MEETING AGENDAS:

The City Manager shall be responsible for the preparation of an agenda for each special meeting. The agenda packet, excluding material exempt from disclosure by state or federal statute, shall be posted on the City's website and distributed to the City Council at least eighteen (18) hours in advance of the meeting.

b) SPECIAL MEETING ORDER OF BUSINESS:

- A. Call to Order
- B. Roll Call
- C. Public Comment
- D. Business Stated in the Special Meeting Notice
- E. Other Business (Only with consent in accordance with City Charter Section 4.3).
- F. Adjournment

4. **REGULAR MEETINGS**:

Regular meetings shall be held at 7:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers. A schedule of regular meetings for the subsequent calendar year shall be adopted by resolution in accordance with the City Charter and the Open Meetings Act.

a) REGULAR MEETING AGENDAS:

The City Manager shall be responsible for the preparation of an agenda for each regular meeting. The agenda packet, excluding material exempt from disclosure by state or federal statute, shall be posted on the City's website and distributed to the City Council at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the meeting. When City Council meets in a closed session pursuant to MCL 15.268 (c), for strategy and negotiation sessions connected with the negotiation of a collective bargaining agreement, the collective bargaining agreement shall be identified on the agenda. When City Council meets in a closed session pursuant to MCL 15.268 (e), to consult with its attorney regarding trial or settlement strategy in connection with specific pending litigation, the specific pending litigation shall be identified on the agenda.

b) REGULAR MEETING ORDER OF BUSINESS:

5. BROADCASTING OF CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS:

All regular meetings of the City Council will be broadcast on the City's government access cable channel and/or made available through online streaming or similar media formats.

6. MINUTES:

The draft City Council meeting minutes will be available on the City's website prior to their inclusion in the next regular agenda packet. The requested approval of the minutes will be included on the Consent Agenda.

7. PROCLAMATIONS AND CONGRATULATORY CERTIFICATES:

Proclamations are ceremonial documents intended to convey positive messages to the Troy Community and are discretionary. Proclamation requests must be submitted in writing by Troy community members (residents and non-resident business owners, employees, and property owners) to the City Manager or his/her designee. Proclamations may be issued to recognize individuals, events, and organizations in Troy and will not be issued to recognize individuals, events, and organizations outside Troy. Proclamations regarding ideology, politics, or religion will not be issued.

Proclamations are often read at a regular City Council meeting and presented to the individual or representatives of the event or organization being recognized. These proclamations must be approved by City Council at a regular meeting preceding the presentation date and at least one representative must attend the presentation. Otherwise, proclamations may be issued without reading or presentation at a City Council meeting. If a presentation is requested, the proclamation will be included on the City Council meeting agenda under the topic of Certificates of Recognition and Special Presentations.

Congratulatory certificates are public announcements made by City Council at ribbon cutting ceremonies, grand openings and other events outside of regular City Council meetings. Congratulatory certificate requests must be submitted in writing by Troy community members (residents and non-resident business owners, employees, and property owners) to the City Manager or his/her designee in advance of the event and do not require City Council action.

8. **RECONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTIONS:**

A motion to reconsider any vote of the Council may be made by either side of the voted motion and shall require the affirmative vote of the majority of the Council Members elect. A motion to reconsider can be made only if no action was taken as a result of the previous vote If such a motion to reconsider passes, and new information has been brought forward, then any member of Council may move to take action on the motion that is to be reconsidered, and any such motion would pass by an affirmative vote of the majority of the

Council Members elect.

9. **RESCISSION OF RESOLUTIONS**

Rescission of any vote of the Council shall require the affirmative vote of the majority of the Council Members elect only if no action was taken as a result of the previous vote.

10. PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Public hearings will be held after required notice has been provided. The City Council may upon affirmative vote of a majority of its members "continue" said hearing at a future date designated in the resolution, without the necessity of re-notification. If the City Council elects to continue the public hearing it will appear in the designated meeting agenda under the topic of Public Hearings.

11. CONSENT AGENDA:

The Consent Agenda includes items of a routine nature and will be approved with one motion. That motion will approve the recommended action for each item on the Consent Agenda. Any Council Member may remove an item from the Consent Agenda and have it considered as a separate item. Any item(s) so removed from the Consent Agenda shall be considered after approval of the motion for all non-removed items on the consent portion of the agenda. Public comment on Consent Agenda items will be permitted pursuant to the Rules of Procedure.

12. APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMITTEES:

a) MAYORAL APPOINTMENTS:

The Mayor shall, with City Council concurrence, appoint members of the following boards or committees as governed by state statute or city ordinances: Board of Review, Brownfield Redevelopment Authority, Civil Service Commission (Act 78), Downtown Development Authority, Economic Development Corporation, Global Troy Advisory Committee, Local Development Finance Authority, Planning Commission, Volunteer Firefighter Incentive Board

b) CITY COUNCIL APPOINTMENTS:

The Mayor Pro Tem shall contact candidates or incumbents for City Council appointments to determine their interest in being nominated or reappointed. Any Council Member, but usually the Mayor Pro Tem, may put forth nominees to the following boards or committees: Animal Control Appeal Board, Building Code Board of Appeals, Charter Revision Committee, Election Commission, Historic District Commission, Liquor Advisory Committee, Municipal Building Authority, Parks and Recreation Board, Personnel Board, Retiree Health Care Benefits Plan & Trust, SOCRRA, SEMCOG, Sustainable Design Review Committee, Traffic Committee, Zoning Board of Appeals

c) NOMINATIONS:

The Mayor or any Council Member desiring to nominate a person for appointment to a board, commission, or committee shall submit the person's name for nomination at a regular meeting during the item Board and Committee Nominations. The person's name will be placed on the agenda for the next regular meeting under the item Board and Committee Appointments. A brief summary of background and personal data as to nominee's qualifications (or a resume) should be submitted on or before the time of nomination, except that such a resume shall not be required for the re-nomination of a current board or commission member, or if the Council unanimously agrees that a resume is not necessary. In the event that more nominees are put forth than positions available, the City Clerk will conduct a roll call vote.

13. CITY COUNCIL REPRESENTATION ON BOARDS AND COMMITTEES:

a) SEMCOG (Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments) Representation:

The Mayor and City Council shall appoint one delegate and one alternate to serve on the SEMCOG General Assembly for a term of two-years, coinciding with the terms of office for City Council.

b) SOCRRA (South Oakland County Resource Recovery Authority) Representation:

The Mayor and City Council shall appoint one delegate and one alternate to serve on the SOCRRA Board for a term of one-year expiring on June 15th.

- c) No member of the City Council shall serve on any committee, commission or board of the City of Troy, except the Retirement System Board of Trustees, Retiree Health Care Benefits Plan and Trust, Volunteer Firefighter Incentive Plan & Trust, Global Troy Advisory Committee, Downtown Development Authority and Local Development Finance Authority (LDFA), unless membership is required by ordinance, statute or the City Charter.
- d) Because quasi-judicial boards and commissions are appointed by Council, and make recommendations to the Council, these recommendations should be made independent of the influence of individual Council Members. As a result, members of City Council shall not appear before or attend meetings of City boards or commissions if they are not appointed members of the City board or committee.

14. MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND VISITORS:

Any person not a member of the City Council may address the Council with recognition of

the Chair, after clearly stating the nature of his/her inquiry or comment. <u>NOTE TO THE</u> <u>PUBLIC</u>: City Council requests that if you do have a question or concern, to bring it to the attention of the appropriate department(s) whenever possible. If you feel that the matter has not been resolved satisfactorily, you are encouraged to bring it to the attention of the City Manager, and if still not resolved satisfactorily, to the Mayor and Council.

- Petitioners of items that are included in the pre-printed agenda booklet shall be given a fifteen (15) minute presentation time that may be extended with the majority consent of City Council.
- Any member of the public, not a petitioner of an item, shall be allowed to speak for up to three (3) minutes to address any Public Hearing item.
- Any member of the public, not a petitioner of an item, does not have the right to engage in discussion or debate with City Council during the Public Comment portions of the meeting.
- All members of the public who wish to address the Council at a meeting shall be allowed to speak only if they have signed up to speak within thirty minutes before or within fifteen minutes after the meeting's start time. Signing up to speak requires each speaker provide his or her name. If the speaker is addressing an item(s) that appears on the pre-printed agenda, then the speaker shall also identify each such agenda item number(s) to be addressed.
- City Council may waive the requirements of this section by a consensus of the City Council.
- Agenda items that are related to topics where there is significant public input anticipated should initiate the scheduling of a special meeting for that specific purpose.

Prior to Public Comment, the Mayor may provide a verbal notification of the rules of decorum for City Council meetings or refer to the pre-printed agenda booklet, which will include the following language, as approved by City Council.

Please direct your comments to the City Council as a whole rather than to any individual. Please do not use expletives or make derogatory or disparaging comments about any individual or group. If you do, there may be immediate consequences including being muted and having your comments omitted from any re-broadcast of the meeting. Please abide by these rules in order to minimize the possibility of disrupting the meeting.

15. RULES OF ORDER:

Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, as clarified by the City Clerk, is hereby adopted, except as modified by these Rules of Procedure, the Charter, or the City Code.

16. ABSENCES AT COUNCIL MEETINGS:

Members of Council who are unable to attend a Council meeting and desire an excused absence shall notify the City Attorney or City Manager of their absence in writing as soon as possible prior to the meeting and indicate the reason for the absence. The reason shall be entered in the proceedings of the Council at the time of each absence.

17. SUSPEND RULES:

The Rules of Procedure may be waived by a simple majority vote, unless specifically noted that a consensus of City Council is sufficient.

18. COUNCIL DISCUSSION:

No member of Council shall speak a second time on any item under discussion until all other members desiring to speak on that item have been heard. No member of Council shall be allowed to speak for more than five (5) minutes at a time.

19. AGENDA ITEMS SUBMITTED BY COUNCIL MEMBERS:

Timely submitted agenda items that, in the City Manager's judgment, do not require a professional opinion from City Administration, will be placed on the next regular agenda for City Council action. These items include, but are not limited to proclamations and celebratory matters. If the City Manager believes that City Council could benefit from additional input from City Administration prior to voting on a referral, then the next regular agenda will contain only a resolution directing City Administration to provide additional input to accompany the Council referral for a future City Council meeting.

20. WIRE COMMUNICATIONS BY AND TO COUNCIL MEMBERS DURING ANY MEETING OF COUNCIL:

Members of Council shall not engage in electronic communication with each other or a member of the public during a regular or special meeting. Electronic communication is defined as e-mail, text message, instant message, website, social media, blog posting, or any other form of communication transmitted or retrieved through the use of an electronic device. *This rule does not apply to remote attendance and participation in meetings pursuant to the Open Meetings Act, as amended.*

Subject:	Request for Approval of Satellite Clerk's Office and Other Election Services – February 27, 2024 Presidential Primary Election

City Management is requesting approval of additional times for the City Clerk's Office to offer election services to Troy voters. Michigan Election Law (MCL 168.761b) requires local clerks to obtain approval from the governing body at least 30 days in advance of the election date for additional times or places that certain election services are offered. Also, clerks are required to notify the Bureau of Elections of those times or places, and post the times and places in a public notice. The City Clerk's Office will publicize these times and the address for the Troy Community Center, Troy Public Library and City Hall on an official public notice, but also on social media, on the City website, and other forms of media.

The Presidential Primary is a unique election experience every four years during the Presidential Election year, and has a tendency to cause some confusion for voters. Unlike any other election held in Michigan, Michigan Election Law requires that for the Presidential Primary, voters must request either a Democratic or Republican ballot, or the no-party ballot option if available. The no-party ballot option is only available if a local nonpartisan contest or proposal is placed on the ballot (ex. School district millage.) For February 27th, Troy only has the Presidential Primary contest on the ballot, so the no-party ballot option will not be needed. The party selection that voters make during the Presidential Primary has no effect on any other election, and since all ballots are secret, their voting choices are not in any way affected by the Presidential Primary. Also, voters' party selections are not stored in the Qualified Voter File (QVF), and cannot be referenced at all by local clerks' offices except to determine which ballot to provide the voter during the Presidential Primary. However, while the party selections cannot be released or referenced by local clerks' offices, the Michigan Democratic and Republican Parties can obtain the list of voters' party selections from the Secretary of State. The City Clerk's Office plans to offer many in-person opportunities for voters leading up to the Presidential Primary because of the unique nature of this election.

For the first time, the Troy City Clerk's Office will open a Satellite Office at the Troy Community Center during the weekend hours of early voting. By establishing a Satellite Office, the Troy City Clerk's Office will be able to offer in-person voter registration, and other election-related services such as absentee ballot issuing and receiving, to Troy voters in a meeting room directly across the hall from the Early Voting Center. Troy voters will be able to register to vote at the Satellite Office, then have the convenience of early voting right across the hall. Michigan Election Law requires that City Council approve the establishment of the Satellite Office at least 30 days in advance. The dates and times of the proposed Satellite Office are:

City Management requests the approval of City Council to establish these additional hours so that the City Clerk's Office may offer absentee ballot services to Troy voters, as well as in-person voter registration.

There will be a Drive-thru Clerk's Office on Thursday, February 22, 2024 from 5:00PM-8:00PM at the east entrance of City Hall. The City Clerk's Office will offer in-person voter registration, absentee ballot services, and other election-related services, while voters remain comfortably in their vehicles.

Michigan Election Law requires that all city and township clerks' offices be open for election services a total of 8 hours during the weekend prior to each election day. Subject:	Angela Blanchard v. City of Troy et al-Proposed Settlement Agreement

Ms. Blanchard filed a lawsuit against the City as a result of a car accident that occurred on February 26, 2021 at about 11:30 pm. On that date, a Troy Police Officer was driving southbound on Rochester Road, when he observed a driver on the northbound side of Rochester speeding at a rate of approximately 80 MPH. The Troy Police Officer used the turnaround just south of Big Beaver, in an attempt to catch the speeding vehicle. As the Troy Police Officer approached Big Beaver, he activated his overhead lights in order to proceed through the red light at the intersection. He made it halfway through the intersection, but as he passed through the second half of the intersection, he was struck by Plaintiff's vehicle.

At the time, Plaintiff did not complain of any injuries, nor did she request an ambulance or other medical attention. Nearly two years later, she filed this lawsuit, alleging that she suffered head, neck and back injuries as a result of the accident. This lawsuit alleges the officer was negligent or grossly negligent, and also is filed against the City as the owner of the vehicle.

On September 28, 2023, the parties participated in the mandatory case evaluation process, where three independent attorneys evaluated statements from the parties and recommend a settlement amount. In this case, the panel recommended that the case be settled for \$30,000. Plaintiff rejected this case evaluation award by failing to timely respond, even though Plaintiff filed a response opposing our motion for summary disposition. Our office continued to prepare for the oral argument for the motion for summary disposition, scheduled for December 13, 2023, and the trial, scheduled January 2, 2024.

On December 12, 2023, Plaintiff's counsel reached out to discuss a possible settlement of the case in advance of the motion for summary disposition. After some negotiation, Plaintiff has agreed to resolve the matter in its entirety for less than the case evaluation award. Based on the settlement offer, the City postponed its motion for summary disposition to allow for City Council action. We recommend Council accept the settlement offer. This would not be an admission of liability, but instead is a recognition of the risks inherent in any litigation, and the anticipated costs and staff time required to proceed to motion and/or trial. If the settlement offer is accepted, the case would be immediately dismissed.

WHEREAS, Hub-level matches were the first step towards reaching the national championship. The Midwest zone comprised 11 states in which USA Cricket created four hub groups. Nikhil competed in the Eastern Midwest Hub which contained teams from Michigan, Ohio, and Indiana. Troy-based, Michigan Youth Cricket Academy, Nikhil's team, won five out of six games and went on to win the Championship for the hub. During the hub-level matches, He earned the title of best batter and best wicket-keeper by scoring 238 runs at an average of 47.65 and taking 12 keeper dismissals; and

WHEREAS, With this stellar performance, Nikhil was appointed as captain of the Eastern Midwest Hub for zonal level matches. The zonal level consisted of four teams, each one represented by the best players from their hub. Yet again, Nikhil excelled through the competition and once more, was titled as best batter for his 163 runs. These distinguishing factors allowed Nikhil, the only player from Michigan to be selected, to attain the opportunity to compete for the Midwest Zone at USA Cricket's U15 National Championship; and

WHEREAS, In addition to this achievement, **Nikhil** has been promoting cricket in the community by establishing a Cricket Club at Troy High School. He planned and organized an inter-school competition with teams from various parts of the state. Nikhil has also coached the Under-11 age group since his freshman year. His commitment and service to the cricket community are unmatched and inspiring for aspiring young cricketers;

Payment for incorrect, or damaged product, may be withheld until issue is resolved or product replacement is delivered. SUBJECT:	Agenda Item – 2024 Poverty Exemption Guidelines (changes from previous year)

History:

MCL 211.7u, provides for a property tax exemption, in whole or part, for the principal residence of persons who, by reason of poverty, are unable to contribute to the public charges.

MCL 211.u requires local units to adopt guidelines that must include the specific income and asset levels of the applicant and the total household income and assets. Local units must adopt guidelines which specify the total household income which will be used to approve or deny poverty exemptions. The adopted income levels shall **not be set lower** than the federal poverty guidelines published in the prior calendar year in the Federal Register by the United States Department of Health and Human Services. This means, for example, that the income level for a household of 3 persons shall not be set lower than \$24,860 which is the amount shown on the following chart for a family of 3 persons. Following are the federal poverty guidelines for use in setting poverty exemption guidelines for 2024 assessments:

MCL 211.u (1) states "The principal residence of a person who, in the judgment of the supervisor and board of review, by reason of poverty, is unable to contribute toward the public charges is eligible for exemption in whole or in part from the collection of taxes under this act. This section does not apply to the property of a corporation."

MCL 211.u (4) states "The governing body of the local assessing unit shall determine and make available to the public the policy and guidelines used for the granting of exemptions under this section. If the local assessing unit maintains a website, the local assessing unit shall make the policy and guidelines, and the form described in subsection (2)(b), available to the public on the website. The guidelines must include, but are not limited to, the specific income and asset levels of the claimant and total household income and assets."

The Board of Review shall approve or deny the request for the poverty exemption. The Board of Review is required to follow the policy and guidelines adopted by the local assessing unit in granting or denying a poverty exemption. The Board of Review is not permitted to deviate from the adopted policy and guidelines.

In order to grant a Poverty Exemption, each community must develop a set of guidelines to determine whether the applicant qualifies for a one (1) year exemption from property taxes. (The exemption may be re-applied for each year)

As the guidelines include a Total Asset limit, and changes to the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines, Council is presented with updated guidelines each year for their approval.

Financial Considerations:

- There were eight (8) exemptions applied for in 2023 at the March Board of Review. Seven
 (7) were granted, totaling \$827,320 in Taxable Value. This amounts to \$8,187.65 in exempted City taxes.
- This year, there were six (6) exemptions granted (of the eight (8) that applied) at the 2023 July Board (\$685,250 Taxable Value), which equaled \$6,781.65 in exempted City taxes.
- The 2023 December Board of Review had two (2) exemptions granted (of the seven (7) that applied). The 2023 Taxable Value was \$220,400, which equaled \$2,181.21 in exempted City taxes.
- The total loss of City taxes for Poverty Exemptions in 2023 was \$17,150.51 (compared to \$15,631.77 in 2022).

Legal Considerations:

• The federal poverty guidelines and asset test are required by the State Tax Commission. The guidelines and asset test meet the requirements of these rulings.

Policy Considerations:

• The guidelines are a State mandated requirement. They do not conform to current Council goals.

Options:

• Council must adopt Poverty Guidelines and an Asset Test. Council may adopt the guidelines as presented, or modify them.

CITY OF TROY POVERTY EXEMPTION GUIDELINES – 2024

MCL 211.7u, provides for a property tax exemption, in whole or part, for the principal residence of persons who, by reason of poverty, are unable to contribute to the public charges.

The City of Troy's standard for approving an exemption under the statute is based on an individual determination of hardship.

This is an exemption from taxes. If you claim poverty under the statute, you must file your claim with an Application for MCL 211.7u Poverty Exemption. This exemption is good for one year.

STANDARD #1 Applicants must file an Application for Poverty Exemption Form 5737 in order to be considered for any exemption. Per MCL 211.7u(2)(b), federal and state income tax returns for the current or immediately preceding year for **all persons residing** in the principal residence, including any property tax credit returns. Additional documentation such as W-2 Forms, Deeds or Land Contracts and personal identification is mandatory, and must be attached to the Affidavit.

STANDARD #2 A Poverty Exemption will not be granted if the household income is greater than the Poverty Guidelines adopted by the City Council.

STANDARD #3 Applicants total assets cannot exceed the Asset Limit Test adopted by the City Council.

*The Board of Review may require a home audit and inspection, done by the Assessing Department, as part of the exemption process.

* The income of every person residing at the home must be reported.

Subject:	Recommended Pay Ranges for Part-time Classifications

History

The City of Troy employs part-time and seasonal employees throughout the City. The number of part-time employees varies based on time of the year, ranging from approximately 250 to more than 1,000 including seasonal and election employees.

We last updated the pay ranges for part-time classifications in January 2023. The Michigan minimum wage increased to \$10.33/hour effective January 1, 2024 and organizational changes required the need for new part-time classifications to be added to the plan. Not all ranges will be adjusted at this time; approximately 40% of the pay ranges will be changed. Of those, the minimums and maximums have been increased by an average of approximately 8%, with some positions evaluated and increased independently, including Election Aide and positions in the Fire and Police Departments. Additionally, the Recreation categories Coordinator, Instructors/Lifeguards and Support, are each being increased \$2.00 to accommodate a planned shift premium bonus to be implemented later this year. The recommendations were developed after surveying similar position at comparable municipalities and libraries, as well as considering recruitment/retention challenges and the current needs of the hiring departments.

Financial

The initial financial impact will result from raising the hourly rate for employees who are below the new pay range minimums. There are currently 24 employees who will receive raises (\$.08 - \$2.50) when the range minimums are increased. The average increase will be approximately \$1.00. In addition, Election Aides will see an hourly increase of \$2.00 when they return to work the next election cycle. The estimated increased cost for these changes is \$25,410/year.

Recommendation

Implement the Part-time Job Classifications and Pay Ranges to update our classifications and align our wages to be competitive in the market and provide additional opportunities to recognize the performance of employees through annual merit increases. The recommended classification plan with pay ranges is attached and would be effective with the pay period beginning January 6, 2024.

- Summer recreation guides will be hitting mailboxes the week of May 8th.
 Registration for the rest of the summer programs will open May 16th for residents and May 18th for non-residents.

- Stated the recreation department will be participating in a lot of outreach at different places in the community to get the word out on our programs and services.

- Sylvan Glen Lake Park was awarded a 1.5 million grant for future amenities. The plan is to add a pavilion, playground, and fishing pier with the grant money.
- Inclusive Park development update Noise study was completed and we
 exceeded the allowable number of decibels. Oakland County wants us to
 complete a soil and environmental study, which we are in the works of starting.
- Working on replacing parts of the boardwalk at the Nature Center.
- Demolished the house next to the Historic Village.
- Adding two new full-time positions in 2024 to the parks department, a laborer and an arborist.
- Athletic field improvements will be happening in 2024. New scoreboard and bases at Flynn Park.
- Looking to upgrade a lot of our gas-powered handheld equipment into battery powered.
- Flynn Park and Brinston Park roof replacement are on the books for 2024.
- A new cricket field at Raintree Park is in the budget for 2024 pending a grant approval.
- Applying for a grant to upgrade the Boulan Park tennis lights to LED.
- At the farm both barns, portable classroom, and restrooms are set to be demolished this year.

Subject:	2011 Early Retirement Incentive Program (ERIP)

During the Great Recession, the City's total Taxable Value decreased by nearly 23% from \$5.56 billion in 2008 to \$4.31 billion in 2013. The City's operating tax revenue decreased by nearly 19% from \$36.49 million in 2008 to \$29.59 million in 2013. During that time, the City's full-time workforce decreased nearly 31% from 467 full-time positions in Fiscal Year 2008-2009 to 323 full-time positions in Fiscal Year 2013-2014.

In 2011, City Council approved an Early Retirement Incentive Program (ERIP) to reduce operational expenses. It authorized the implementation of the Program for Classified and Exempt Employees (non-union) on February 7, 2011. City Council also authorized City Management to negotiate participation in the Early Retirement Incentive Program with represented Employees Retirement System members in collective bargaining proceedings. Implementation of the Program was authorized by collective bargaining group as follows:

- November 22, 2010: Troy Fire Staff Officers Association (TFSOA)
- May 16, 2011: American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) and Michigan Association of Police (MAP)
- June 6, 2011: Troy Command Officers Association (TCOA)
- July 11, 2011: Troy Police Officers Association (TPOA)
- July 25, 2011: Troy Communications Supervisors Association (TCSA)

Although the timing for each collective bargaining group was different, the incentives were the same. The Program included two options: a cash incentive or a Defined Contribution to Defined Benefit conversion. The purpose of this memo is to provide information about the TPOA implementation.

- Ninety-four (94) employees were TPOA members at the time.
- Forty-five (45) of those 94 employees were in the Defined Benefit plan.
- Forty-nine (49) of those 94 employees were in the Defined Contribution plan.
- Thirty (30) of those 94 employees (nearly 32%) were eligible for the Program.
- Fifteen (15) of those 30 eligible employees (50%) retired under the Program as described below.

Cash Incentive

Eligible employees in either the Defined Benefit or Defined Contribution Pension Plan could elect to receive a cash incentive equal to \$1,000 for each actual complete year of credited service with the City as of June 30, 2011. However, the incentive was not included in any computation of Final Average Compensation (FAC) under any provisions of the Retirement System.

- Eleven (11) employees in the Defined Benefit plan elected to receive a cash incentive and retired under the ERIP.
- Only one (1) employee in the Defined Contribution plan elected to receive a cash incentive and retired under the ERIP.

Defined Contribution to Defined Benefit Conversion

Eligible employees in the Defined Contribution Pension Plan could elect to transfer their total accumulated balance (including all employee contributions and interest thereon) to the Defined Benefit Plan. Their pension was based solely on the value of their accumulated Defined Contribution balance at the date of transfer as determined by the Retirement System's actuary.

- Only four (4) employees in the Defined Contribution plan elected to transfer their balance to the Defined Benefit plan and receive a pension based solely on the value of those assets.
 - 1. Age 56.4; \$1.37 million transferred; \$118,000 regular annual pension
 - 2. Age 61.4; \$1.13 million transferred; \$107,000 regular annual pension
 - 3. Age 55.7; \$1.01 million transferred; \$86,000 regular annual pension
 - 4. Age 56.6; \$960,000 transferred; \$83,000 regular annual pension

The 2011 Early Retirement Incentive Program (ERIP) was a cost-saving workforce reduction strategy and an alternative to layoffs. The City currently has budgeted positions vacant due to the nationwide police officer shortage. Accordingly, City Management does not recommend negotiating an early retirement incentive program at this time.

Following ratification of the TPOA collective bargaining agreement in July 2023, the City began investigating the feasibility of creating a new defined benefit and/or a hybrid retirement plan for the bargaining unit. The City and the Union are meeting in January and may discuss a conversion program at that time.

LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING

This Agreement, entered into on the 5th day of July, 2011, between the City of Troy and the Troy Police Officers Association:

The Early Retirement Incentive Plan consisting of two options (cash incentive of \$1,000.00 per year of service or Defined Contribution to Defined Benefit) will be offered to the eligible members of the bargaining unit (upon the same eligibility rules as other City of Troy bargaining units) provided that an actuarial evaluation for said Plan determines that implementation of the Plan for the unit is at least cost-neutral. The Plan shall be made available to eligible members for a period of at least 90 days after ratification.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the *Early Retirement Incentive Program* **MAY BE** offered during a minimum 45-day window of opportunity, with said incentive being the option of a lump sum payment of \$1,000 for each full year of retirement service as of June 30, 2011 or the conversion from a DC pension plan to a DB pension plan; and

EARLY RETIREMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM 2011 TPOA Employees

TPOA

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The City of Troy is implementing an Early Retirement Incentive Program (ERIP) in the form of two options, a cash incentive or a DC to DB conversion, in order to reduce personnel costs to accommodate budget constraints. The Program is being offered to eligible employees if the employee signs a Letter of Understanding with the City of Troy and, in the case of a union employee, that union agrees to the terms and conditions of the Program. Participation in the Program is entirely voluntary. Interested eligible employees in either the DB Pension Plan or the DC Pension Plan may elect to participate, but can only select one of the available options. Participating employees must retire on or before the date specified in the Plan.

INCENTIVE OPTIONS:

Cash Incentive

Eligible employees in either the Defined Benefit or Defined Contribution Pension Plan may elect to receive a cash incentive that is equal to \$1,000 for each actual complete year of credited service with the City of Troy as of June 30, 2011. The cash incentive will be issued not later than three weeks after the employees' designated retirement date. The number of years for which the cash incentive is made shall not include years of service granted for prior government service from an employer other than the City of Troy.

For those employees participating in the Defined Benefit Pension Plan, the incentive will not be included in any computation of Final Average Compensation (FAC) under any provisions of the Retirement System. Both the City and the employee will make the required contributions to the plan.

For those employees participating in the Defined Contribution Pension Plan, the employee and the City of Troy will each contribute their appropriate percentage to the plan.

DC to DB Conversion

Eligible employees in the Defined Contribution Pension Plan may elect to transfer their total accumulated balance (including all employee contributions and interest thereon) to the City of Troy Employees Retirement System-Defined Benefit Plan. Their pension will be based solely on the value of their accumulated DC account balance at the date of transfer as determined by the Retirement System's actuary.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Employees who are eligible to participate in the Early Retirement Incentive Program will be sent notification following approval of the program by City Council. The notice will include the Early Retirement Incentive Program Voluntary Resignation Agreement and Release of Claims form, a Receipt form and a Waiver of Review Period form. Employees will have a minimum of

45 days in which to consider the Release in order to seek counsel regarding their rights. If the employee chooses to waive the 45-day review period, he/she must submit the signed Waiver. Employees who elect to participate in the Program must submit the signed Release not later than the end of the window period and will have seven (7) days after signing to revoke their decision. Retirement dates are subject to approval, and retirement must occur not later than November 15, 2011.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

The Program will be available to TPOA employees who meet the age and service requirements for normal or early retirement as of June 30, 2011, or are within five years of eligibility, as defined by the Employee Retirement System Ordinance or by the respective collective bargaining agreement. These eligibility requirements are as follows:

<u>GROUP A</u> Regular Retirement 25 years of service; or Age 60 with 10 years of service Early Retirement

Age 55 with 10 years of service

GROUP B

Those within five (5) years of eligibility as stated above

Window Period (45-days minimum):July 20, 2011 through October 18, 2011Revocation Period Ends (7 days):October 25, 2011Retirement Not Later Than:November 15, 2011

CITY OF TROY VOLUNTARY RESIGNATION AGREEMENT AND RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS

WHEREAS, the Employee is currently actively working and is employed full-time by the Employer and is represented by the Troy Police Officers Association (TPOA); and

WHEREAS, the Employer has negotiated with the TPOA union and on June 27, 2011 the TPOA ratified a tentative agreement agreeing to implement an Early Retirement Incentive Plan ("ERIP"); and

WHEREAS, on July 11, 2011 the Employer ratified the tentative agreement to implement an Early Retirement Incentive Plan ("ERIP"); and

WHEREAS, as a result of the ratification the Employer is offering the Employee an opportunity to participate in the ERIP; and

WHEREAS, the Employee desires to irrevocably resign and retire from his/her employment with the Employer in order to participate in the ERIP; and

WHEREAS, the Employee acknowledges that she/he has been advised that she/he has no less than forty-five (45) days to consider this Release; and she/he has seven (7) days after signing this Release within which to revoke this Release, which will not become effective or enforceable until after the seven (7) day revocation period expires; and that she/he should consult an attorney before signing this Release;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth below, the Employee and the Employer agree as follows:

1. The Employee hereby tenders his/her voluntary resignation and intends to retire from his/her employment with the Employer which shall become effective upon acceptance by the Employer but in no event earlier than July 20, 2011 and in no event later than November 15, 2011.

2. After receipt of this Release executed by the Employee and upon the Employee's resignation and retirement, the Employer will provide the Employee with an Early Retirement Incentive Program Defined Contribution (DC) to Defined Benefit (DB) Conversion. The employee will be permitted to transfer his/her total accumulated balance (including all employee contributions and interest thereon) to the City of Troy Employees Retirement System-Defined Benefit Plan (the

The employee acknowledges that in consideration of the ability to revert back to the Retirement System Defined Benefit Plan, his/her pension will be based solely on the value of his/her accumulated Defined Contribution Plan account balance at the date of transfer as determined by the Retirement System's actuary.

3. Accordingly, the employee hereby authorizes and requests ICMA-RC, the Plan Administrator for the City of Troy Employees Defined Contribution Plan to transfer the total amount of his/her account balance in the Defined Contribution Plan as of _______, 2011, in the amount of \$_______, to the Defined Benefit Plan in accordance with this Agreement. His/her accumulated balance in the Defined Contribution Plan consists of employee contributions in the amount of \$_______ plus investment returns on the employee contributions in the amount of \$_______ plus investment returns on the employee contributions in the amount of \$_______ plus investment returns on the employee contributions in the amount of \$_______ plus investment returns on the employer contributions in the amount of \$_______. The employee fully understands and acknowledges that only his/her accumulated employee contributions in the Defined Contributions in the Defined Benefit Plan and subject to distribution in the event of his/her death and death of his/her named beneficiary, if any, prior to the receipt of total pension payments greater than the total of his/her accumulated contributions.

4. The Employee acknowledges that his/her resignation and retirement is voluntary, and he/she may not be eligible for unemployment compensation benefits.

5. In exchange for the Employee accepting the benefits of the ERIP, the Employee, for herself/himself, her/his successors, representatives, heirs and assigns, hereby releases and discharges the Employer, ICMA-RC, the Retirement System, its Board of Trustees, and any entities which are affiliated with it, its elected officials, employees, attorneys, insurers, agents, successors and assigns, and the TPOA union, from any and all suits, causes of action, complaints, charges, grievances, obligations, demands, or claims of any kind, whether in law or in equity, either direct or indirect or known or unknown ("CLAIMS'), including pre- and post-employment causes of action, based on the Employee's employment with and termination of employment with the City of Troy, except for any claims or rights that may arise after the date the Employee signed this Release or rights which cannot by law be released by private agreement. This Release specifically includes but is not limited to:

- a. Any and all CLAIMS arising out of the transfer of assets as provided herein or benefits provided by, or associated solely with, participation in the Defined Contribution Plan;
- b. Any and all CLAIMS for future wages or fringe benefits;
- c. Any and all CLAIMS for wrongful discharge, including any rights to just cause protection, or continued employment with the Employer;

- d. Any and all CLAIMS of alleged employment discrimination in violation of federal, state or local statute, ordinance, judicial precedent or executive order, including but not limited to claims of discrimination on the basis of age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin, veteran status, disability, height, weight, familial status or marital status, as well as claims under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, 42 U.S.C. 2000 <u>et seq.</u>, as amended, the 1978 Pregnancy Discrimination Act, 42 U.S.C. 2000 <u>et seq.</u>, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, 29 U.S.C. 621 <u>et seq.</u>, as amended, the Americans with Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. 12101 <u>et seq.</u>, as amended, the Rehabilitation Act of 1972, 29 U.S.C. 701 <u>et seq.</u>, as amended, the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act, MCL 37.2101 <u>et seq.</u>, as amended, the Persons with Disabilities Civil Rights Act, 37.1101 <u>et seq.</u>, as amended and any other applicable federal, state or local law, rule or ordinance of any kind;
- e. Any and all suits in tort, including but not limited to any CLAIMS for misrepresentation, invasion of privacy, negligence, defamation, libel, slander, interference with contract or prospective economic advantage, intentional infliction of emotional distress, and negligence;
- f. Any and all CLAIMS for compensation or damages of any kind;
- g. Any and all CLAIMS under any federal or state statute relating to employee benefits or pensions (except claims to any benefits, such as pension, already vested and due and owing to the Employee through state law);
- h. Any and all CLAIMS for attorney fees and costs;
- i. Any and all contractual CLAIMS (except claims made based upon this Agreement);
- j. Any and all CLAIMS arising out of the United States Constitution or the State of Michigan Constitution, including, but not limited to, any and all due process or equal protection claims;
- k. Any and all CLAIMS regarding the tax consequences or liability regarding the ERIP;
- 1. Any and all CLAIMS concerning the terms and conditions or any other aspect of the ERIP;
- m. Any and all suits or administrative CLAIMS of any nature now pending in any forum whatsoever, to the extent they apply to the Employee; and
- n. Any and all CLAIMS to a monetary recovery based upon claims or rights which may not be released by law through a private agreement.

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6. The Employee hereby waives any and all rights of reemployment, seniority or reinstatement she/he may have with the Employer.

7. To retain eligibility, the Employee must fulfill her/his contractual obligations through her/his retirement date to participate in the ERIP. Death or disability after application for the ERIP is not considered a failure to fulfill contractual obligations and will not preclude an eligible employee from participating in the ERIP.

8. The Employee agrees that she/he has not relied upon any representations regarding the availability or unavailability of this specific program or one similar to it for employees in the future. It is the current intent of the City that this ERIP is a one-time offer. However, the Employer reserves the right to offer or not offer the same or similar program at any time in the future.

9. The Employee understands that this ERIP may be a taxable event and could be taxed based upon the appropriate rates per IRS regulations.

10. This Release and the ERIP Program Description contain the entire understanding and agreement of the parties regarding this subject matter, and shall be binding upon the respective parties and their heirs, executors, successors, administrators and assigns. Any prior agreements, promises, negotiations, or representations, either oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Release and the ERIP Program Description but not expressly set forth in this Release or the ERIP Program Description are of no force and effect.

11. If any provision of this Release is adjudicated by a court of competent jurisdiction or a governmental agency to be invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Release that can be given effect without the invalid or unenforceable provision.

12. The terms of this Release are contractual and not a mere recital, and may not be changed, waived, discharged, or terminated, except by a written amendment to this Release executed by the parties to this Release.

13. This Release and the ERIP shall be governed by the laws of the State of Michigan.

14. The parties acknowledge that the Employee has been provided forty-five (45) days to consider this Resignation and Release of All Claims and has been advised of the right to consult with an attorney regarding the terms of this document and her/his rights under the state and federal statutes and common law. To formalize such acknowledgment, the Employee has executed "Exhibit A" attached to this Release. The Employee further acknowledges that, should she/he determine to execute this Release prior to the expiration of the forty-five (45) day review period, she/he shall execute "Exhibit B", waiving such forty-five (45) day review period. Finally, the parties acknowledge that the Employee may revoke this Resignation and Release of All Claims by providing written notice of such revocation to the City of Troy before the end of seven (7) days following the execution of this Release.

By signing below, the Employee acknowledges that he/she has read all seven (7) pages of this Release, including Exhibits A and B, and fully understands their contents, terms and effect. He/she has been advised to talk to an attorney before signing this Resignation and Release of All Claims. By signing below, he/she is stating that he/she has either talked to an attorney about this Resignation and Release of All Claims, or that he/she wishes to go ahead on his/her own without the advice of any attorney. He/she is agreeing to the terms and conditions of this Resignation and Release of All Claims voluntarily and of his/her own free will.

I acknowledge that:

- 1. I have received a copy of the Resignation and Release of All Claims. I have read all seven (7) pages, including Exhibits "A" and "B". I fully understand its terms and recognize that it is legal and binding. I am acting voluntarily and of my own free will in signing it.
- 2. I have not relied on any representations or promises of any kind made to me except for those contained in the Program Description and the Resignation and Release of All Claims. I have not relied on any representations about the availability or unavailability of this specific program or one similar to it for City of Troy employees in the future.
- 3. I have had the opportunity to seek, and have been advised in writing to seek legal advice before signing the Resignation and Release of All Claims. I have either done so or voluntarily decided not to consult an attorney.
- 4. I have been provided with a copy of the Program Description for the Early Retirement Incentive Program (ERIP).
- 5. I was given at least forty-five (45) days to consider the ERIP and its implications, as well as the Resignation and Release of All Claims, before signing it.
- 6. On the date I received the ERIP Resignation and Release of All Claims, I received information supplied by the Employer concerning (1) the class, unit, or group of individuals covered by the ERIP, the eligibility factors for the ERIP, and any time limits applicable to the ERIP and (2) the job titles and ages of all individuals eligible for the ERIP and the ages of all individuals in the same organizational unit who are not eligible for the ERIP.
- 7. I understand there is a seven (7) day "revocation" period. This means that I have seven (7) days after signing the Resignation and Release of all Claims to revoke it by providing written notice of such revocation to the City of Troy. After the seven-day period, however, my decision is binding and irrevocable.
- 8. Participation in the ERIP is something of value, in addition to that to which I am already entitled.

Dear Human Resource Director Menig:

Officer Rockafellow was hired April 5, 1999. At that time she was in the Defined Benefit retirement plan, (DB). Under the DB plan, only legally married spouses are eligible for death benefits. As a result of Lisa's marital status, she opted out of the DB plan, and into the Defined Contribution (DC) plan so her domestic partner could receive benefits. At the time of her hire, and opting into DC, same sex marriage was not recognized in the United States.

This status changed in 2015, whereupon same sex marriage was legalized. Lisa and her domestic partner were legally married on July 13, 2015.

Through no fault of her own, Lisa opted out of the DB because of her situation, if same sex marriage had been legal at her date of hire, and or, at the opt date, Lisa would have remained in the original DB plan.

The union, on behalf of our members, is requesting to allow her to opt back into the DB plan, with all past service credits. All DC monies would be returned to the city/pension plan.

Opting back into the DB plan has been done before, and we believe in all fairness, Lisa should be given the same opportunity.

Your attention to this would be appreciated.
