

<u>History</u>

- 52-4 District Court
 - Oakland County has leased space from the City of Troy for many years.
 - In 1996, the City of Troy entered into an agreement with Oakland County and allowed for the relocation of the 52-4 District Court from City Hall to its current location at 520 W. Big Beaver.
 - The location of the 52-4 District Court was the former Troy Community Center.
 - o The lease agreement requires that the City keep the facility in good repair.
 - The carpet in all 3 courtrooms is original to the renovations performed in 1996.
 - The carpet is delaminating from the backing, causing it to buckle and creating tripping hazards throughout the 3 courtrooms.
 - The walls have a carpeted cove base which is against fire code. Minor refinishing to the walls will be necessary.
 - The carpet was identified as severely worn in the Facilities Condition Assessment and Analysis.
- Troy Community Center
 - The Troy Community Center was constructed in two separate phases. The first phase was completed in 2002 and the second phase was completed in 2003.
 - The banquet rooms are a main source of revenue for the Troy Community Center at approximately \$300,000/year.
 - The Kids Korner and Preschool flooring is original to the facility. The Preschool serves approximately 400 children per year. Kids Korner, which is the babysitting room for the fitness area and contributes to pass revenue, serves about 3,600 children per year.

History (continued)

 The carpet and flooring have reached the end of their useful and aesthetic life and needs to be replaced.

The dining room serves approximately 13,000 senior lunches annually and is also

available for rental.

 Many of the rooms in the building are also used for senior recreation and regular programming.

The flooring was identified as worn in the Facilities Condition Assessment and

Analysis.

Purchasing

On November 19, 2020, a bid opening was conducted as required by City Charter and Code to furnish all equipment, material and labor to provide and install flooring at the 52-4 District Court and the Troy Community Center. The bid was posted on the Michigan Inter-governmental Trade Network (MITN) website; www.mitn.info. Three (3) companies attended the Pre-Bid meeting which was held on November 13, 2020. One (1) bid response was received. Below is a detailed summary of potential vendors:

<u>MITN</u> provides a resourceful online platform to streamline the procurement process, reduce costs, and make it easier and more transparent for vendors to do business with the City of Troy.

Active MITN members with a current membership and paying annual dues receive automatic electronic notification which allows instant access to Bids, RFPS and Quote opportunities with the City.

Active MITN non-paying members are responsible to monitor and check the MITN website for opportunities to do business with the City.

<u>Inactive MITN member</u> status can occur when a company does not renew their account upon expiration. Inactive members cannot be notified of solicitations or access any bid information.

- Flooring Services Inc. of Livonia, MI is the sole bidder meeting all bid specifications and is being recommended for the replacement and installation of the flooring as specified at the 52-4 District Court and the Troy Community Center.
