The Traffic Committee is composed of seven Troy citizens who have volunteered their time to the City to be involved in traffic and safety problems. The stated role of this Committee is:

- a. To give first hearing to citizens' requests and obtain their input.
- b. To make recommendations to the City Council based on technical considerations, traffic surveys, established standards, and evaluation of citizen input.
- c. To identify hazardous locations and recommend improvements to reduce the potential for traffic accidents.

The recommendations and conclusions arrived at this evening will be forwarded to the City Council for their final action. Any citizen can discuss these recommendations before City Council. The items discussed at the Traffic Committee meeting will be placed on the City Council Agenda by the City Manager. The earliest date these items might be considered by City Council would normally be 10 days to 2 weeks from the Traffic Committee meeting. **If you are interested, you may wish to contact the City Manager's Office in order to determine when a particular item is on the Agenda.**

Persons wishing to speak before this Committee should attempt to hold their remarks to no more than 5 minutes. Please try to keep your remarks relevant to the subject at hand. Please speak only when recognized by the Chair. These comments are made to keep this meeting moving along. Anyone wishing to be heard will be heard; we are here to listen and help in solving or resolving your particular problem.

4. **Install a Traffic Signal on Wattles Road, Following Relocation of Troy Athens High School Driveway Opposite Victoria Drive.**

The Traffic Committee considered this item in December, and deferred action until the Planning Commission approved the joint driveway between the school and the church.

At their February 13, 2001 regular meeting, the Planning Commission approved a revised plan for the St. Petka church site, which will permit the Athens High School driveway from Wattles Road to be relocated and combined with the proposed St. Petka drive at a point directly opposite Victoria Drive. The enclosed plan indicates the proposed boulevarded drive entry, which will jointly serve Athens High School and the St. Petka Church.

The Athens PTO requests reconsideration of this item. Please see the attached letter from the PTO president. The PTO has also sent a petition signed by more than 1,600 Troy residents requesting the traffic signal.

The City has conducted a number of traffic studies focused on traffic safety issues at Troy Athens High School. The analysis conducted earlier this year indicated that the traffic signal warrants (State guidelines describing thresholds for traffic volume, signal spacing and traffic crashes) were not met at the point where the high school driveway intersects with Wattles Road. The school district requested the City to perform another analysis for the relocation of a driveway directly opposite Victoria Drive, a residential city street.

Another analysis was performed during the first two weeks of this school year to determine if the warrants would be met if the Athens driveway were to be relocated at a point opposite Victoria Drive. Higher traffic volume was projected for Victoria Drive, as can be expected with the installation of a traffic signal. With such a configuration, two of the minor traffic signal volume warrants were met. As such, installation of a traffic signal may be justified for this configuration, contingent on recommendation by the Traffic Committee, based on input from residents of the area.

This location is very close to the signal at the intersection of Wattles/John R Road and may increase congestion on Wattles Road. Also, the residential street Victoria

may have increased traffic volumes due to the signal. The school district's suggestion is to have the traffic signal cycle during school arrival and dismissal times only.

SUGGESTED RESOLUTION:

- a. Recommend installation of a traffic signal on Wattles Road, following relocation of Troy Athens High School driveway opposite Victoria Drive.
- b. Recommend no changes.

5. Restrict Parking for 100' on South Side of Witherbee across from 1581 Witherbee.

Ms. Rosemarie Newton of 1581 Witherbee requests that the area across from her driveway on Witherbee be signed NO PARKING. Ms. Newton reports that there is a vehicle parked opposite her driveway, which makes it extremely difficult to back her car out of her driveway. This is particularly very difficult when there is snow and snow banks. Ms. Newton also has to make regular hospital visits due to her health condition and has had instances where she had to wait in her driveway till the parked car was moved, missing doctors appointments. Mediation/talking to the neighbors to come to a mutual compromise was suggested and deemed not to work. Therefore, Ms. Newton requests the Traffic Committee to consider this parking restriction. The north side of Witherbee is marked NO PARKING in accordance with City policy.

Officer Larry Schultz also visited the area and talked to Ms. Newton. Her concern is during winter, when there are snow banks. Some other solutions may be to clear the driveway better and/or to request our Department of Public Works to clear the snow better in the area of 1581.

SUGGESTED RESOLUTIONS:

- a. Recommend establishing a NO PARKING zone for 100' on the south side of Witherbee opposite 1581 Witherbee.
- b. Recommend no changes.

6. Restrict Parking in front of 4148 Cypress.

Mr. Lin Qun of 4148 Cypress requests that the area in front of his house be marked NO PARKING. Mr. Qun reports that there is a very old truck parked in front of his house. Mr. Qun says the old truck is in front of his living room window and that it is an eyesore and detracts from the view from the living room. As shown in the aerial photograph, this home is located on the cul-de-sac on Cypress.

SUGGESTED RESOLUTIONS:

- a. Recommend establishing a NO PARKING ZONE in front of 4148 Cypress.
- b. Recommend no changes.

7. Install Fire Lanes at Midtown Square, Maple and Coolidge, Troy

The Troy Fire Department requests establishment of the proposed fire lanes at Midtown Square, Maple and Coolidge. Section 8.28, Chapter 106, Troy City Code, provides for the establishment of fire lanes on private property. The Fire Department recommends that the fire lanes shown on the attached sketch be provided to allow proper deployment of and travel by emergency vehicles (fire, police, medical).

SUGGESTED RESOLUTION:

- a. Recommend that the fire lanes/tow away zones shown in the attached sketch be established at Midtown Square, Maple and Coolidge.

8. Install Fire Lanes at 61-79 W Long Lake Road.

The Troy Fire Department requests establishment of the proposed fire lanes at 61-79 W Long Lake Rd. Section 8.28, Chapter 106, Troy City Code, provides for the establishment of fire lanes on private property. The Fire Department recommends that the fire lanes shown on the attached sketch be provided to allow proper deployment of and travel by emergency vehicles (fire, police, medical).

SUGGESTED RESOLUTION:

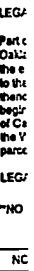
- a. Recommend that the fire lanes/tow away zones shown in the attached sketch be established at 61-79 W. Long Lake Road.


Athens PTO urges the Troy Traffic Commission to vote yes on a new light at the intersection of Wattles and Victoria Drive. A light at the new entrance to Athens High School would allow the children of Troy a safe way to enter and leave the high school. Without a light the children are at risk every time they cross the street. We have already had one child hit by a car as he crossed Wattles this fall. The PTO feels that 100 children crossing in the dark every morning, without a light to protect them, is not the safest plan the city can offer. The best solution is to put up a light that would work before and after school thereby giving children of Troy a safe intersection to cross at. Troy is the City of the Future, Protecting our children ensures our future.

We will have representatives at your February meeting from the PTO, student congress, bus drivers and citizens of Troy. Dear John,

As we discussed today, due to the short notice given, neither my husband nor I are able to attend the Traffic Committee Meeting scheduled for November 15, however, we are VEEHEMENTLY opposed to installing a traffic light at Wattles Road and Victoria Drive for the following reasons:

- In the seven years we have lived on Victoria, the traffic volume has significantly increased. It is clear that many people use our subdivision (Heritage Park) and Raintree Subdivision as a way to enter Rochester Road without having to travel to the light at Wattles and Rochester Road. Adding a light will increase this opportunity for travelers looking for "short cuts."
- We are very concerned and frustrated about the speed at which people travel on Victoria now. There are over 30 children that live in Heritage Park and the average speed traveled is significantly above the posted speed of 25 miles per hour. I would suggest it is closer to 40 miles per hour. Adding a traffic signal will increase the number of people driving 40 m.p.h. on Victoria. I know that our neighborhood association has brought this to the attention of the City before. This is a significant safety hazard for the residents that live in Heritage Park.
- I believe that this additional traffic will negatively effect our property values.
- There has been no public notification that I am aware of regarding the property directly across from Victoria Drive being used for a driveway for the school. When zoning notification was posted I called and was told this was for a church. There was no mention of a joint agreement between the school and the church for a driveway. I would have expressed concern at that time if the school's intent had been communicated. If this was the intent, it should have been CLEARLY communicated to all interested parties, and it wasn't.

I would suggest that the following be considered as possible solutions for Troy Athens:

- Consider putting a light at the current Wattles entrance to Troy Athens.
- Evaluate the current traffic pattern within the Troy Athens property. There are two additional entrances on John R. I would suggest that the pattern could be shifted to eliminate the heaviest usage of Wattles (a two-lane road) as an entrance point and have the greatest amount of traffic flow on to John R (a five-lane road).
- Crack down on the speeders on both Wattles Road and Victoria Drive.

I believe that the people most greatly impacted by the signal are residents of Heritage Park and I believe that our voice should be heard and recognized. I implore you to look at all options before creating a greater safety hazard in our subdivision. We moved to Troy for safety and security. Find a safe solution for both Troy Athens and Heritage Park residents.

Subject: Traffic Signal Analysis

Dear Mr. Adamczyk:

As you know, a number of traffic studies have been conducted by the City focused on traffic safety issues at Troy Athens High School. This is to keep you informed about the results of the recent traffic signal warrant study performed for the intersection of Wattles Road and Troy Athens High School driveway. The analysis conducted earlier this year indicated that the traffic signal warrants (State guidelines describing thresholds for traffic volume, signal spacing and traffic crashes) were not met for the intersection.

However, we performed another analysis during the first 2 weeks of school this year to analyze if the warrants were met if the Athens driveway is relocated to a point opposite Victoria Drive, a residential City street. We also projected higher traffic volume on Victoria Drive as can be expected with the installation of a traffic signal. With such a configuration, two of the minor traffic signal volume warrants were met. As such, installation of a traffic signal may be justified for this configuration, contingent on recommendation by the Traffic Committee and approval by the City Council.

Please note that this location is very close to the signal at the intersection of Wattles/John R road and may increase congestion on Wattles Road. Also, the residential street Victoria may have increased traffic volumes due to the signal. If approved, our recommendation reflecting your suggestion would be to have the traffic signal cycle during school arrival and dismissal times only. To give a historic perspective on cost sharing for traffic signal serving school traffic, the City did not participate in the costs of installing a signal at the intersection of Troy High School driveway and Long Lake Road. We also hope that our earlier recommendations for safer school traffic circulation are also considered to enhance traffic safety at the school.

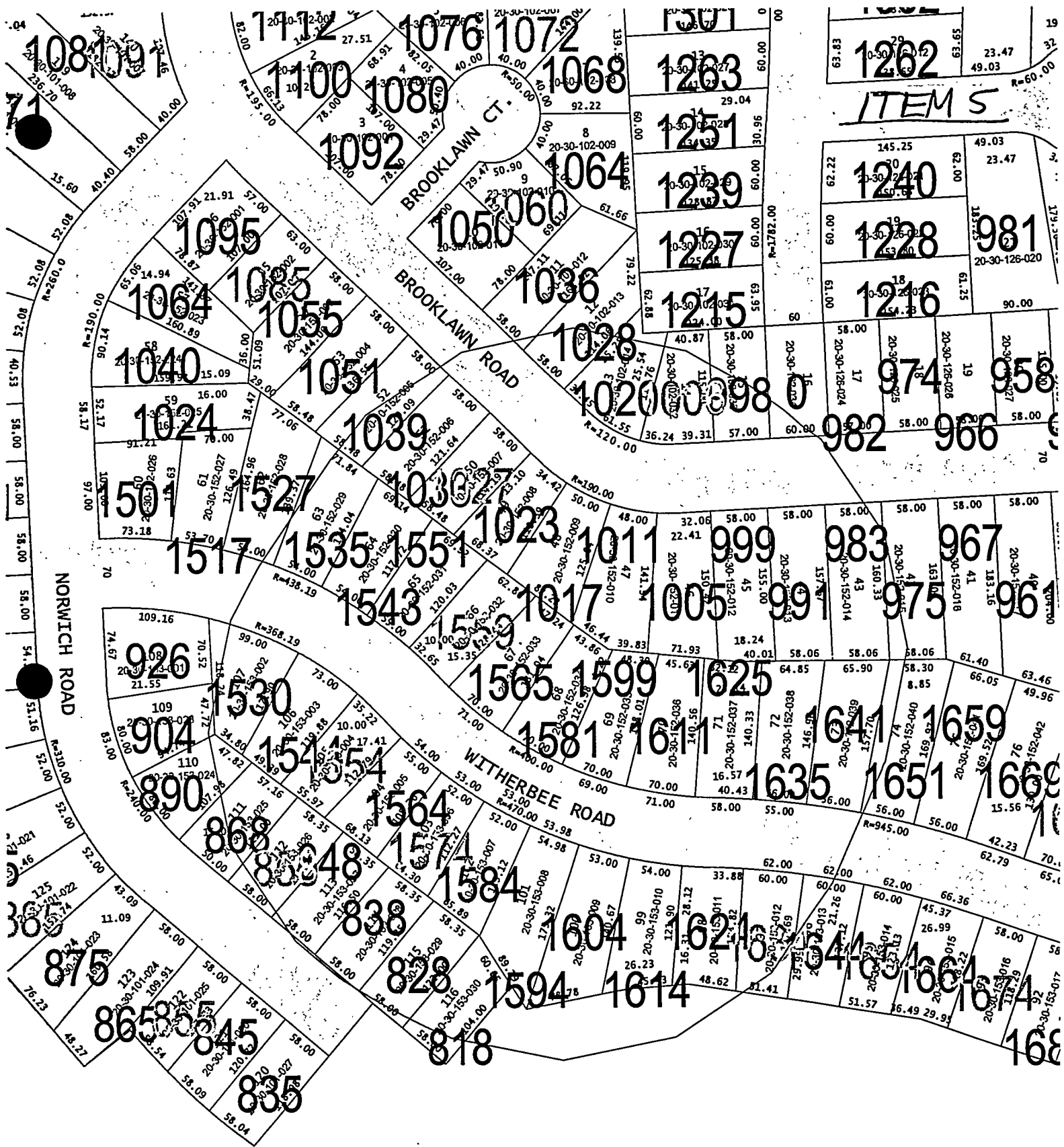
This matter will be placed on the Traffic Committee agenda in November. The Traffic Committee is a citizen advisory board that meets the 3rd Wednesday of each month at City Hall and makes recommendations on traffic control devices to the City Council. Their recommendations will be sent to the City Council for action within 10 days to 2 weeks after the meeting. If a signal were to be approved for this location, we would expect the School District to submit geometric design plans for the new intersection to be reviewed for traffic signal installation.
