Motion by <u>Jayne Saeger</u>, supported by <u>Kathleen Melchert</u>, to APPROVE the minutes of the March 6, 1991 meeting.

The Board invited Mr. Ken Smith of the Invisible Fencing Company to attend the meeting to inform them about the company's increasingly popular product. The Board was concerned about the safety and reliability of the product and possible ordinance changes to cover the subject.

The Board viewed a short videotape produced by Invisible Fencing and heard a presentation by Mr. Smith. A thorough question and answer session followed.

The system consists of a radio antenna wire buried 3" deep around the perimeter of the property or wherever the homeowner wants it, such as protecting landscaping. The wire carries a low frequency, rapidly pulsating AM radio signal. The signal is usually adjusted to cover a space of four to six feet on both sides of the buried wire. The receiver is on a collar worn by the dog. When the animal approaches the buried wire, he gets an

audible warning not to get closer to the boundary. If the animal disregards the warning the collar emits a mild shock. There is some discomfort to the animal, but the shock is completely harmless.

The signal will not interfere with any other electronic equipment such as garage door openers, computers, microwaves or pacemakers.

Small flags are placed around the area protected as a signal to the dog. Green flags are used in winter and white flags in summer to contrast with landscape colors. An Invisible Fencing Inc. representative works with the dog for a short time and instructs the owner on conducting regular training sessions to teach the dog to avoid the protected area. The dog is not allowed in the yard alone for four or five days. After the initial training period, the dog is properly conditioned not to approach the boundary. Even an agressive or vicious dog will not go through the boundary. Over a period of a few weeks as the dog becomes accustomed to the boundaries, the flags are removed.

Jayne Saeger asked about any possible regulations the City should initiate. Lt. Houghton said that other cities are not putting any restrictions on the use of this system.

Assistant City Attorney Dawn Schumacher and Captain Terry Moore said that according to Troy City Ordinance Chapter 90 this system would constitute adequate control.

Mrs. Barnard felt that there should be some way of informing the public that this invisible restraint is in use on the site to prevent fear of attack when a dog is seen loose on the property. Mr. Smith replied that Invisible Fencing Inc. now posts several signs at the edge of the property indicating such. These are small metal signs without advertising or company phone number.

<u>Jayne Saeger</u> moved to recommend to City Council that permanent signs be required to give reasonable notice to the public that an invisible containment system is in place. Supported by <u>Melchert</u>.



LYME DISEASE! WHAT MAKES IT TICK

What's small, black, and dangerous to your health and to the health of your pets? What's been called the second epidemic of the 1990's, following AIDS? What's baffled physicians and veterinarians across America and around the world, making it one of the most incorrectly diagnosed illnesses of our time?

Lyme Disease and its major carrier, the deer tick, are the answers to these questions. Lyme Disease has become one of the hot health topics around the country. So far, the disease has been identified in 44 states and in every continent except Antarctica.

Five thousand cases of Lyme Disease in humans were officially reported last year. However, health officials are convinced that the actual number could be ten times higher, since doctors aren't usually required to report the disease. "We all assume Lyme is underreported," said Dr. Ted Tsai of the Centers for Disease Control.

Experts estimate that the incidence of Lyme Disease in animals is ten times that in humans. The illness is difficult to diagnose in domestic animals and ever harder to treat. For dogs and cats, the danger from spending much of their time outdoors is evident since it only takes one tick bite to infect an animal Until recently, environmental measures designed to combat the deer tick population have proved to be oblimited success and costly. While such devices as tick collars and pet shampoos can be helpful in reducing the risk of Lyme Disease, they are noticely to the collars and potential.

On the bright side, however, researchers have now developed a vaccine to prevent Lyme Disease in dogs. In experimental challenge studies, the vaccine proved to be 100 percent effective in reducing the infection upon testing with live Lyme Diseas organisms. In addition, the vaccine virtuall prevented all symptoms of Lyme Disease in vaccinated dogs.


Keep your dog away from anti-freeze. Even a small amount can be deadly if your animal ingests it. Anti-freeze has a swe taste that attracts both dogs and cats. Clean it up if some sp. onto your driveway or in your garage.

Begging can be a problem for some dogs at dinner time, but it was mentioned to me by one of our customers that perhaps the best way to cure a dog of begging is to let him taste the cooking!

It's a good idea to add a small amount of vegetable oil a teaspoon for every 35 lbs. of weight) to your dog's food each day during cold weather. The oil will offset the drying effect of heated air on the animal's skin and coat.

Dogs do not need any vitamin C in their food, since it is manufactured within their bodies. On the other hand, fat is required regularly in rather large portions. All types of animal fat are beneficial to dogs, and fat intake should be increased for dogs who spend a lot of time outdoors in the winter.





ENGINEERING REPORT

This report provides technical details regarding the Invisible Fencing System.

The Invisible Fencing System consists of a fixed transmitter unit and one or more battery powered receivers that are worn by the dog or dogs.

The transmitter emits magnetic field waves in the audio frequency spectrum centered around 10 kilo hertz. This frequency is not suspected to cause any radiological or psychological health hazards to humans, animals or plants.

The low power levels used in a typical two acre system are comparable to that of a household flashlight. The magnetic waves are propagated through the air by means of a buried loop wire antenna. This insulated wire is normally buried around the perimeter of the area to be protected, at a depth of about three inches. This is done to avoid the possibility of the wire being tripped over or cut by a mower.

In the event that the insulated wire should break and an animal or person comes into contact with the wire, the risk of any discomfort or injury is negligible. The loop wire does not carry the correction signal, but just carries a radio signal which will activate the dog's receiver..

In the event that an electrical connection occurs to the loop, many safety features are incorporated into the system to prevent hazardous shocks. The first is that the system operates on a low voltage class two transformer, meaning, there is no hazardous secondary voltage and the unit passes all known U.S. and Canadian safety standards. The power supply is limited to eighteen volts RMS inside the transmitter and this voltage is considered by the entire world to be safe.

Secondly, the loop is protected from high voltage build-up by varistors so no voltages greater that 42 volts should ever exist from the wire to ground. It is understood that 42 volts is considered to be a "safety extra low voltage".

Thirdly, an eight-foot-long grounding rod is installed near the loop wire to aid in the discharge of built-up voltages. The receiver operates as does a cassette tape player. ENGINEERING REPORT February 15, 1989 Page 2

The tiny audio frequency voltage picked by the antenna is amplified by microcircuits to drive a pulsing circuit that corrects the dog. The dog is given a one-second audible warning which allows the dog to avoid experiencing the correction.

The pulses are designed not to promote any short or long-term physical or nervous damage. Typically, the manufacturers and sellers will subject themselves to this pulse for testing purposes and no ill effects have been noted. The power usage in the receiver is so low that a small 7½ volt silver-oxide battery will power the receiver for up to six months.

Veterinarians and dog lovers world-wide have been supporting the use of this system for over ten years.

In conclusion, Invisible Fence Company, Inc., believes that the Invisible Fencing System should not be categorized as an electric fence. This system has been proven to be an alternative to such devices and is considered to be kinder to the animal and more esthetically pleasing in a planned residential community than conventional fences.
