NEW BUSINESS

1. RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT

Moved by Thorley

Supported by: Smith

The present Rules and Regulations of the Civil Service Commission, drafted pursuant to Act 78 of 1935, presently require that all new Patrolmen move into the City within one year after their certification as a regular employee of the City (18 months from this date of hire). A discussion was held by the Commission with regard to the subject.

The T.P.O.A. has requested that the Commission consider changing the residency requirement to an area extending five miles beyond the perimeter mile roads of the City. The request is made on the basis that moderate priced housing is not available within the City limits at the present time. They would also like more variety in the neighborhoods and types of environment available to them. The administration recognizes the problem and recommends to the Commission that the residency requirement be extended the distance of three miles from the Cities boundaries. The City boundaries include 34 square miles. A three mile extension would expand the area to 144 square miles. A five mile extension would expand the area to 256 square miles.
