NEW BUSINESS

A. City of Southfield SmartZone Program Overview

Rochelle Katz-Freeman provided an overview of the Southfield SmartZone Program. The new 6,300 square foot Centrepolis Accelerator, located on Lawrence Technological University's campus, officially opened on October 4, 2019. The center will provide product design technologies, prototyping equipment, mixed reality technologies and collaborative workspace for small manufacturers and hardware entrepreneurs. The facility also features a 3D printing lab and mentors to work with the entrepreneurial companies and to help commercialize ideas. Dan Radomski is the executive director.

Fred Zorn indicated that the Southfield SmartZone helped to facilitate the rebuilding of Eleven Mile Road and Franklin Road, the placement of signage in the SmartZone, and encouraged the retention of Federal Mogul/Tenneco. The Oakland County Career Center is located in the Southfield SmartZone.

B. City of Troy SmartZone Program Overview

Glenn Lapin provided an overview of the Troy SmartZone Program. The first phase of Automation Alley's parking lot infrastructure improvements has been completed. The front portion of the parking lot off of Bellingham was rebuilt providing significant safety and aesthetic improvements to the entry way. Phases II & III of the improvements will be implemented in years two and three of the program. Tom Kelly, Executive Director and CEO of Automation Alley, provided additional Automation Alley updates in his report.

Glenn Lapin also reported on continued development in and around the SmartZone. Altair is planning a major campus expansion including the development of an indoor winter garden, conference center, new office tower and parking structure. Part of the proposed development will occur just outside of the LDFA tax capture area. NBS Commercial Interiors has expanded its facility adjacent to Automation Alley.

C. Automation Alley Update

Tom Kelly, Executive Director & CEO of Automation Alley, provided an overview of Automation Alley's current initiatives. Integr8, Automation Alley's signature global conference, will be held at Detroit's TCF Center on November 6th.

Automation Alley has been selected as a World Economic Forum Advanced Manufacturing Hub – the world's first designee through this program. The World Economic Forum selection will enable Automation Alley to partner with top universities and companies on Industry 4.0 initiatives. Automation Alley will also be partnering with major companies like Boeing, Ford, Amazon, Tenneco and others on a program to bring about engineering education change.

Tom Kelly also discussed Automation Alley's infrastructure needs, including critical parking lot improvements. Phase I of parking lot improvements, through the support of LDFA funding, has been completed. Phases II & III are expected to get underway in the coming months. Mr. Kelly expressed his appreciation for the LDFA's support.
