4.) Regular Business

A. Ethics Ordinance Overview and Signature

- Committee Member Burrus asked for a synopsis of the updates that had been made to the Ethics Ordinance.
- Mayor Baker provided an overview of the changes to the Ethics Ordinance.

B. International Day Thoughts and Planning

- Committee Member Bica-Grodsky noted that she represents international day and that
 the group should talk about who wants to be part of international day and be going to
 the meetings with the Troy Family Daze group. She also noted that the 2021
 International Day Subcommittee was strong and made the event easier.
- Mayor Baker said that the group would be working with Troy Family Daze for the 2022 International Days Festival. The Troy Family Daze organization has a record setting year and the group should ask for more funding to sponsor more performers at International Day.
- Committee Member Bica-Grodsky noted that some performers didn't want to participate because they wanted a controlled environment and that an indoor setting is preferred. She also noted that Sterling Heights has the cultural exchange which was held in 2020 at Dodge Park. Arts beats and eats is also a great place to find performers. Rochester's Apple event is also happening but it may be too close to our event to get performers from it.
- Mayor Baker suggested that we have a separate event in 2023, indoor.
- Student Representative Liu noted that TAB had an indoor international day but that she
 encouraged an outside event as it encourages people to participate freely and show up
 to the event when they feel most comfortable.
- Committee Member Chezick suggested two bands (Michigan 126th army band and the US army field band) for the 2022 International Day Event and Committee Member Bica-Grodsky noted they would be terrific for the naturalization day.
- The group discussed that we need to get more funds for the performers for 2022 because many groups have had financial challenges, and can't perform without appropriate pay.

- Committee Member Bica-Grodsky mentioned that the group is hoping a few big corporations and community groups will support us strongly in order to support these performing groups better. Companies can buy the rights to Troy International Daze.
- Committee Member Chezick asked if the group would know if the naturalization ceremony was happening since it has not happened for the last couple of years.
- Committee Member Bica-Grodsky noted that we will know in the next month if the ceremony is going to happen for Troy Family Daze. The Troy Daze Festival will be held 16-18th of September 2022. They may offer us some time on Saturday and then Sunday the 18th will be the full international day.
- Mayor Baker noted we should plan for the naturalization event to happen on September 16, 2022 and that the bands mentioned from Committee Member Chezick would be great performers.
- Mayor Baker suggested the group should focus heavily on international day in 2022 and then maybe next spring (2023) do an indoor cultural event maybe in the community center.
- Committee Member Burrus suggested connecting with a group that already has their own cultural event to determine best practices does it for best practices.
