The Michigan Historical Commission is pleased to inform you that the Fractional School District No. 10 Schoolhouse, Troy, Michigan, Oakland County, has been listed in the State Register of Historic Places.

The Commission has judged the site to be historically and/or architecturally significant.

The State Register was established by Act 10 of the Public Acts of 1955 to recognize historic sites in Michigan. This designation also enables the purchase and display of an official state identification marker noting the name of the site and the year of its listing. Sites with unusual historical significance may, upon application to the commission, also be deemed eligible for an informational marker.
