Jiggins house survey ready for reproduction, passed around and read. Extensive research required of Mrs. Scott to finish survey on this 1860 structure. Motion by Dill to accept the survey as written and Historic designation to register. Midgley support. Vote: Ayes; all Nays; none. Motion carried. Midgley to finish research on house on Norton.

Old Business:

Karl Johnson has refused to move the Wagon Shop from Troy Corners to the Village Green. Johnson's opinion is the structure is too deteriorated. Mr. Dill respectfully disagrees. Mr. Dill and his crew have stripped the interior to ready the structure for removal and he has learned the building is actually two independent structures. He feels we should not abandon the project. Mrs. Renshaw read the letter from Mr. Johnson and reply to Mr. Johnson from Mr. Fred Stanley.

New Business:

Mr. Dill proposed a small fund raising venture in order to establish a general fund for our commission. He will research the possibilities and report at our next business meeting.

Mrs. Scott reminded the members of a public hearing scheduled for 12/12/77 at City Hall and urged us to attend. Her concern, of course, is based on the length of time that the Wagon Shop has been kicked around and the fear of destruction of the remaining sites located there.
