Mr. Jones: Lot 5 - S/P #7. Adjoining Gows. Representing a real estate firm with plans ready to go to the drawing board for a professional building.

Mrs. Krell: Would like to see the corners preserved. She lives there and would like to see it maintained.

Mr. Stiller: Moved here for the atmosphere that has been existing and does not want a lot of "modern" commercial around him.

Mr. Jones: Requested a plat by the next meeting showing the exact location of the lots affected.

Mr.Giachino offered the option that at any time the 51% of the property owners request the Historic District designation be dropped - such request will be presented to City Council.
