The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a pre-hearing to consider DTE Gas Company's (DTE Gas) June 30, 2025 application requesting the Commission to: 1) approve for the twelve-month period ending March 31, 2025, DTE Gas's Gas Cost Recovery (GCR) customers' revenues of \$549.42 million inclusive of Reservation Charge revenues, its Net Recoverable Costs of \$566.7 million inclusive of approximately \$835 thousand over-recovery related to 2023-2024 GCR and expenses, combined with \$1.63 million of interest from 2024-2025 GCR, to result in a net under-recovery of \$15.65 million for GCR customers that was incurred through reasonable and prudent actions; 2) approve for the twelve-month period ending March 31, 2025, DTE Gas's Gas Cost Choice (GCC) customers Reservation Charge revenues of \$3.74 million, GCC customers' \$3.51 million in reservation expense, the roll-in of approximately \$0.05 million related to the GCC customers' 2023-2024 reconciliation and \$0.01 million of interest expense owed to GCC customers to result in a net GCC customer over-recovery of approximately \$0.27 million; 3) approve that the calculated amount of DTE Gas's under-recoveries, together with interest, is correct, and that the disposition of that amount is consistent with the intent and in accordance with the guidelines established by the Commission in its Orders; and 4) grant DTE Gas other relief as deemed necessary.

The prehearing is scheduled to be held remotely by video conference or teleconference. Persons filing a petition to intervene will be advised of the process for participating in the hearing.

Any person wishing to appear at the hearing to make a statement of position without becoming a party to the case may participate by filing an appearance. To file an appearance, the individual must attend the hearing and advise the presiding administrative law judge of their wish to make a statement of position. Mich Admin Code, R 792.10413 (Rule 413).
