Dear Mayor and City Council,

As the Treasurer of Elli's House, I am requesting that you recognize our Non-Profit is recognized in the community.

Elli's House is a 501(C)3 nonprofit serving homeless and runaway women involved in human trafficking in the city of Detroit. Our mission is to abolish sex trafficking in the City of Detroit through building relationships, offering safe shelter, and providing education. We currently have a two-year residential shelter program in our two homes, and we provide food, hygiene, and clothing to survivors weekly through street outreach.

The State of Michigan has granted our organization a one-time license for our latest event. But will not reissue a new license until we get recognized as a non-profit organization by our home City. The organization uses my business office address for ease of correspondence and donations. The bulk of our meetings take place at Faith Lutheran Church in Troy, of which Elli's House has recently become a member of the Chamber of Commerce.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSES

Elli's House is a religious organization affiliated with the Michigan District—Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. Our mission is to provide temporary shelter for runaway, homeless, or young girls involved in sex trafficking, in the city of Detroit, with family reunification as our primary goal. Currently, Elli's House has not begun to implement any of its proposed programs, as it is waiting to acquire more funding.

Elli's House initial program of interest is short term shelter, in order to provide safety, food, and clothing, in attempt to keep young girls, ages 11-17, from being homeless or involved in sex trafficking. We would come in contact with these girls from Detroit Police Department, local hospitals, foster care workers, and Wayne County Social Service organization. We would also make contact with runaway, homeless and sex trafficked girls using our street outreach ministry. Our street outreach involves teams, comprised of 3 or 4 people, to provide toiletries and food to homeless girls on the east side area of Detroit. Our outreach teams will be responsible for visiting the same location, once a week for one year.

Elli's House will provide a safe place, for girls to receive medical services, mental health services, educational assistance, and social service programs in order to rebuild a quality life, with a safe living environment. Elli's House will provide 6 beds, and provide shelter for 21 days. All residents will be required to attend school, receive medical treatment, when necessary, and participate in group therapy and/or individual therapy. Elli's House will provide transportation to all appointments.

Upon exiting the program, each girl will be assigned a case worker, who will follow up with the family or foster care family. The case worker will be responsible for developing an individual program to assist the family with conflict management, short term and long term goals, and any other assistance that is needed. The case worker is responsible for following up with the client, once a week, and eventually once a month, as decided by the case worker.

Article VI

The Corporation shall be operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. No director or officer of the Corporation shall possess any right or title or interest in the corporate property or earnings of the Corporation in his or her individual or private capacity, and no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in the furtherance of the purposes set forth above.

Article VII

The Corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise to influence legislation to such extent as would result in the loss of exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, nor shall the Corporation participate in or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Nothwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by: (a) a corporation exempt from tax under 501(c)(3) or the Internal Revenue Code; or (b) by a corporation, contributions, which are deductible under Section 170(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Article VIII

A volunteer director of the Corporation shall not be personally liable to the Corporation or its members for monetary damages for a breach of the director's fiduciary duty, except for liability.

- a) For a breach of the director's duty of loyalty to the Corporation or to its members;
- b) For acts or omissions not in good faith or that involve intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law;
- c) For a violation of Section 551(1) of the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act:
- d) For a transaction from which the director derived an improper personal benefit; or
- e) For an act or mission that is grossly negligent.

If, after approval by the member of this provision, the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act is amended to authorize corporate action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of directors, then the liability of a director of the Corporation shall be eliminated or limited to the fullest extent permitted by the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act, as so amended.

Any repeal or modifications of the foregoing provisions of this Article by the member of the Corporation shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director or Board of Directors at the time of such repeal or modification.

Article IX

The corporation assumes all liability to any person other than the Corporation or its members for all acts or omissions of any volunteer director incurred in the good faith performance of the volunteer director's duties.

Article X

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, any property remaining after providing the debts and obligations of the Corporation shall be distributed at the direction of the Board of Directors of the Corporation for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or to the federal, state or local government, for a public purpose.

Article XI

Any reference in these Articles of Incorporation to a section of the Internal Revenue Code shall be interpreted to include reference to corresponding provisions of any applicable future Internal Revenue Law.





Our mission is to provide temporary shelter for runaway girls and/or young women caught in human trafficking in the city of Detroit; with family reunification as our primary goal, when possible.



Our street outreach team is committed to building consistent relationships. The teams are intentionally kept small and we require a 6 month or 1 year commitment so that our girls see the same team members working, and as a result develop deep friendships. Teams will reach out to young women who work on the streets and at times visit drug houses, to initiate conversation and build trusting friendships.




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MORE INFORMATION

MINUTES OF THE INITIAL AND ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF ELLI'S HOUSE, INC.

November 28, 2016

The first and organizational meeting of the Board of Directors of Elli's House, Inc., a Michigan nonproft corporation (the "Corporation"), was held at Faith Lutheran Church in Troy, MI on the 28th day of November, 2016, a central location of the Board members.

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BY-LAWS OF ELLI'S HOUSE, A NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATION

ARTICLE 1: ORGANIZATION

Name: The name of the organization shall be Elli's House ("Corporation). The organization, by a vote from the Board of Directors, may change the name of the organization.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSES

Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for religious, charitable, and educational purposes with the meaning of Section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue code of 1986 or the corresponding provision or provisions of any subsequent United States revenue law (the "Code").

Elli's House is a religious organization affiliated with the Michigan District—Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. Our mission is to provide temporary shelter for runaway, homeless, or young girls involved in sex trafficking, in the city of Detroit, with family reunification as our primary goal. Currently, Elli's House has not begun to implement any of its proposed programs, as it is waiting to acquire more funding.

Article III: GENERAL MEEETING

Section 1. Meetings

The Board intentionally establishes a basic structure for its Board meetings; the structure's purpose is to assist the Board and Executive Director in processing information in a way that allows them to maintain a policy-based orientation. Additional items can be added as needed, but the basic elements need to be maintained. The Board agenda structure shall work in tandem with the policy review and monitoring calendar.

The Board agenda structure shall consist of these basic elements:

- Board Education and Spiritual Growth. This will include time for devotion and prayer.
- Shorter-Term Activities. This will include informational updates on the financial situation of the organization, a review of key organizational actions taken since the last board meeting, and other reports and updates needed to keep the Board informed. It will also include time for shorter-term matters requiring Board decision or action.
- Longer-Term Activities. This will include reviews as needed of longer-term strategic plan elements, funding strategies and budget reviews. Items from the "Board Review Calendar," including policy-based governance matters, will also be included here. Time will be allocated for longer-term matters requiring Board decision or action.
- Other Items. Included here will be any other announcement and confirmation of the next Board meeting.

Section 2. Special Meeting

Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of any board member. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board of Directors may fix any location, as the place for holding any special meeting of the Board called by them.

Section 3. Notice

Notice of any special meeting of the Board of Directors shall be given at least two (2) days in advance of the meeting by telephone, facsimile or electronic methods or by written notice. Any Director may waive notice of any meeting.

Section 4. Vacancies

Whenever any vacancy occurs in the Board of Directors it shall be filled without undue delay by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Board of Directors at a regular meeting. Vacancies may be created and filled according to specific methods approved by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Powers of the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall have charge, control and management of the business, property, personnel, affairs and funds of the corporation and shall have the power and authority to do and perform all acts and functions permitted for an organization described in section 541©(3) of the Code not insistent with these bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation, or the laws of the State of Michigan.

ARTICLE IV: SALARIES

The Executive Director shall hire and fix the compensation of any and all employees which he/she in their discretion may determine to be necessary for the conduct of the business of the organization.

ARTICLE V: REGISTRED OFFICE AND AGENT

The address of its initial registered office is 2237 Orpington, Troy, MI 48083, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Debra Ellinger.

ARTICLE V: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Board of Directors

The business and affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors, which is the governing body of the corporation. The corporation is organized on a non-stock basis.

Section2. Numbers

The Board of Directors of this corporation shall not be less than three (3) and no more than eight (8) and the number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors is four (4).

Section 3. Election of Directors

The directors to be chosen shall be elected by the currently serving Board of Directors of this organization and they shall serve for a term of 2 years after which they may be re-elected for another 2 year term.

Section 4. Removal

Any director may be removed from office with or without cause at any annual or special meeting of the Board of Directors by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the directors in office.

Section 5. Powers and Tasks

The Board of Directors shall have the control of the affairs and business of this organization. Such Board of Directors shall only act in the name of the organization when it shall be regularly convened by its chairman after due notice to all the directors of such meeting. The Board of Directors sole official connection to the operational organization, its achievements and conduct will be through the Executive Director.

The Board will govern lawfully, observing the principles of the Policy Governance model, with an emphasis on (a) an outward vision rather than an internal preoccupation, (b) encouragement of diversity in viewpoints, (c) strategic leadership more than administrative detail, (d) clear distinction of Board and Executive Director roles, (e) collective rather than individual decisions, (f) future rather than past or present and (g) pro-activity rather than reactivity.

The initial officers of the organization shall be as follows:

• Chair: Jake Ellinger

Vice Chair: Monica Mokrzan-Destefanis

Committee Chair: Teresa Austreng

Secretary: Tom Destefanis

The Chair shall preside at meetings, and shall:

- Develop meeting agenda and ensure all content discussed is according to Board policy and procedure.
- Ensures all members have an opportunity to openly share their views and opinions, if so desired.
- Assure deliberation will be fair, open, and thorough, but also timely, orderly and kept to the point.
- Arrange for an annual performance appraisal of the Executive Director
- Discuss and review any corrective action with Executive Director
- Act in all areas of Board management left unstated within these policies as long as this
 action is not in conflict with other Board policies.

The Vice-Chair shall in the event of the absence or inability of the President to exercise his office become acting president of the organization with all the rights, privileges, and powers as if he/she had been the duly elected president, shall:

- Preside at meetings of the Board of Directors of Elli's House in the absence of the Chair.
- Discuss and review any corrective actions with the Chair and Executive Director.
- Assume responsibilities delegated by the Chair.

The Committee Chair, in the absence or inability of the President or Vice-Chair to exercise his officer becoming acting president of the organization with all the rights, privileges, and powers as if he/she had been the duly elected president, shall:

- Keep Committee Heads informed of all policies, rules and guidelines established by the Board f Directors.
- Communicate meeting agenda and minutes to all Committee Heads.
- Liaison between the Board of Directors and Committee Heads.
- Reports any corrective action as it relates to the Committee Heads.

The Secretary shall keep the records of the organization in appropriate books, and shall:

- Record the official minutes of the Board's meetings and direct their distribution to the members of the Board, the Executive Director, and any others that ask.
- Preserve approved minutes.
- Preserve regular and special reports made to the Board and, at its direction, make summaries or copies of them available.

Officers shall by virtue of their office be members of the Board of Directors.

No officer shall for reason of his office be entitled to receive any salary or compensation, byt nothing herein shall be construed to prevent an officer or director for receiving any compensation from the organization for duties other than as a director or officer.

ARTICLE VI: COMMITTEES

All committee of this organization shall;

- Observe that its responsibilities flow from the Board's description of its job, which shall be set forth in a formal written charge with an appropriate period for existence, and shall not impinge upon responsibilities delegated to the Executive Director.
- Have no decision making authority.
- Not make recommendations. Rather, it is to gather facts for Board decisions.
- Not manage any part of Elli's House.

ARTICLE VII: AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be altered, amended, repealed or added to by an affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the members.
