

Sites #1, #6, #9 (Knight park), #11




Current Vacant Park Land (Site #11)

Vacant Parcel #11 – 3500 John R

- Section 24, east side of John R, north of Big Beaver
- Red building with 2 garage doors and a school bell
- Partially developed with soccer goals and two small bleachers
- Many mature trees, partially mowed and maintained
- Includes portion of Shanahan Drain
- 6.13 acres
