To All Bidders:

Please be advised that the City of Troy Purchasing Department has authorized the following ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS regarding Bid Proposal ITB-COT 21-02, Stamped Concrete Pathway- Troy Historic Village. The CHANGES will be considered an integral part of the original proposal documents.

QUESTION: Do the brick pavers have a concrete base course?

ANSWER: The City has replaced several brick pavers over the years and have found no concrete under the bricks.

QUESTION: Does the City want the concrete ribbons around the brick pavers removed as well? **ANSWER:** The intent is to have these borders remain.

QUESTION: Will vendors be allowed to use the gates off the parking lot for access? **ANSWER:** Yes, that is correct.

QUESTION: What type of stamped concrete does the City Require? There are two types out there.

ANSWER: Please see Page 36 section B- Materials of the bid specifications for the type of stamped concrete specified.

Historic Village Stamped Concrete

History

Patrons that visit the many historical structures use the pathways within the Troy Historic Village. In 2014, approximately half of the brick paver pathways were replaced with stamped concrete (**Resolution #2014-08-106-J-4a**). The remaining brick pavers continued to deteriorate and now require replacement.

City Council approved the renovation of the Niles/Barnard House in November of 2019 (**Resolution #2019-11-143**). The renovation did not include the exterior walkways, as it was to be included with the remaining brick paver replacement to ensure a consistent look. The exterior work will complete the Niles/Barnard Renovation and the building will be able to be programed.

Projects at the Troy Historic Village are coordinated with the Troy Historical Society (THS) staff to ensure the least amount of disruption to its programs. The bid requires this project to be completed between August 17, 2020 and September 25, 2020, which was the timeframe the THS requested.

Purchasing

- On July 23, 2020 a bid opening was conducted as required by City Charter/Code for the Stamped Concrete at the Troy Historic Village.
- The bid was posted on the Michigan Intergovernmental Trade Network (MITN); www.mitn.info.
- Five hundred and twelve (512) vendors were notified via the MITN website.
- Three (3) bid responses were received. Below is a detailed summary of potential vendors for the bid opportunity:

MITN provides a resourceful online platform to streamline the procurement process, reduce costs, and make it easier and more transparent for vendors to do business with the City of Troy.

Active MITN members with a current membership and paying annual dues receive automatic electronic notification which allows instant access to Bids, RFPS and Quote opportunities with the City.

Active MITN non-paying members are responsible to monitor and check the MITN website for opportunities to do business with the City. Inactive MITN member status can occur when a company does not renew their account upon expiration. Inactive members cannot be notified of solicitations or access any bid information.
